What to do in August?

Suggestions for your fall gardening.

August temperatures often reach recorded highs across the country, ranging from the 80s in coastal and northern areas and high altitudes to the 90s and even breaking the 100- degree mark in the Midwest, South, and Southwest.



Although the days are beginning to shorten and autumn is forecast by a few yellowing leaves, many summer vegetable and fruits, such as tomatoes, cucumbers, sweet corn, and watermelons are reaching their peak of ripeness. Keep plants well watered to make the most of the home-grown harvest. Rural fairs and harvest festivals brighten late summer days and provide a chance to stimulate some new ideas for your future planting.

With the heat and diminished rainfall, drought is common in much of the country, presenting a real challenge to anyone with a lawn and plants to care for. In most states, two weeks without rain signals an official drought. Western mountain vistas take on tawny hues and water rationing is a regular feature in much areas. As cooler mountain air clashes with warm air rising from flat lands, thunderstorms frequently result, and the threat of forest fires set off by lighting is a serious concern.
