#### ROME FEDERATED GARDEN CLUBS, INC. November Minutes

The November 5 meeting of RFGC. Inc. was held at the Garden Center with 13 members representing six clubs present. President Anita Bridges called the meeting to order and thanked Mountain View Garden Club for providing refreshments. Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, Chaplain Ann Bradfield presented a "Prayer for Thanksgiving".

#### **Guest Speaker**

Joy Puckett introduced the program, speaker Savannah Cecchini, a senior from Berry College, who presented a PowerPoint program outlining the essential relationship between the Monarch butterfly and native milkweeds. Both populations are declining due to use of insecticides and herbicides, loss of habitat, and climate change.

## **President's Report**

President Bridges noted that the minutes of the August meeting are available in Federated Facts and asked for corrections or additions; being none, the minutes were approved as presented.

President Bridges announced the addition of a Seed Swap Box on the deck at the Visitors' Center; everyone is invited to donate seeds or take seeds from the box.

The Penny Pines Box is on the desk by the front door, and will remain there until the goal of at least \$50 is in it. The proceeds go toward planting trees on public lands.

President Bridges reported the City of Rome will issue a resolution honoring the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the RFGC, Inc. The resolution will be issued in a ceremony at 5:30pm, November 12, in the Sam King Room in the Rome City Auditorium.

# **Garden Spots**

Donna Knighten reported information from GCG offering the availability of a Blue Star Marker restorer. There are 10 markers in Rome.Donna has visited all of the Garden Spots with the City Horticulturist and his Assistant prior to requesting the City take over Spots where clubs are no longer in existence or are unable to maintain their spots. The City will begin maintenance of the Clock Tower at the completion of the current 2-year project. They have already begun maintenance of the Myrtle Hill Meditation Garden.

## **Committee Reports**

#### **Environmental Concerns**

Jennifer Kearns reported on a Xerxes Association project,"Leave the Leaves", explaining that leaves provide mulch for plants and shelter for numerous creatures over the winter. In addition, she pointed out that gas-powered blowers and mowers contribute to pollution.

Savannah Cecchini, who presented today's program will be starting a milkweed project in a fallow field on Jennifer's farm.

Jan Mendence introduced this year's Bussey's Flower Cards. Last year's campaign earned \$1520 with 76 cards sold. Cards were distributed to the club presidents at this meeting.
