
### CELEBRATES ITS 100th ANNIVERSARY WITH BRICK PROJECT

In the fall of 1924 five ladies met to form a garden club in Rome. It became Seven Hills Garden Club, the first in Rome and the third in Georgia. According to its charter, its mission was to advance gardening, to promote city beautification, to stimulate an interest in cooperative gardening, and to aid in the protection of forests, wildflowers, birds, and streams. Seven Hills has actively worked to fulfill its mission for 100 years. Among other projects, it established an outdoor reading room garden at the Carnegie Library. When the Sara Hightower Regional Rome-Floyd County Library was built, Seven Hills was invited to design a similar outdoor reading room garden for that library.

With the help of the University of Georgia landscape architect students, the city of Rome, and the late John Schultz, the garden was created and has been maintained by Seven Hills members since then. In honor of our 100th anniversary, we are creating an area of dedicated, engraved brick inside the entrance of the garden and offering an opportunity for community members to be a part of the history of the garden. Your personalized brick will not only leave a lasting impression, but also support the ongoing work of Seven Hills including the enhancement of the garden. Bricks can be engraved with up to 3 lines of 18 characters per line including blank spaces and will be \$100 each.
